You should answer the questions as fully as possible and not keep back any information, whether for or against the application. **Guidance On Completing A
Public Rights of Way User Evidence Form**

1. Completed forms are intended to provide preliminary evidence about the application. When we commence detailed research, an officer from the County Council may contact you to seek further information or ask you to be interviewed about your evidence. It would be very helpful if you were able to agree to be interviewed by an officer of Somerset County Council and/or appear at a public inquiry (see questions 21 and 22 below). Although it may be some years before these interviews or a potential inquiry take place, they are crucial aspects of the decision making process. Inquiries are kept as informal as possible and, if you do agree to give evidence, the County Council will be able to guide you through the process.

2. The form should be completed by one person only and should relate to only one route. If you need more space please continue on a separate sheet which will need to be attached to this statement. Once you are satisfied that you have included all the information that may be relevant, please return this form to the person making the application so that it can be submitted with, or form part of, an application seeking a change to the Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way.

3. Please answer all questions as fully as possible ensuring that dates can be easily understood by others. For example, in response to the question '*during which years did you use the way?*', answers such as "*many*", "*various*" or "*when I had my first horse*" are not as helpful as specifying the precise years.

4. If completing the statement by hand, please ensure it is written legibly and in black ink.

5. This document is also available in Braille, large print, on tape and on disc and we can translate it into different languages. We can provide a member of staff to discuss the details.
